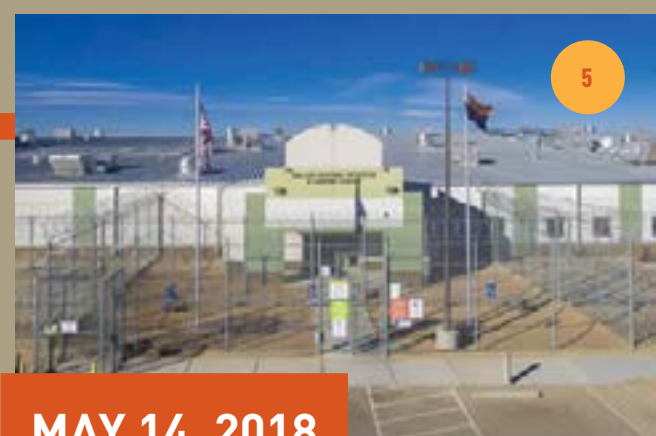


How many agencies and private companies does it take to kill an asylum-seeker?

Our investigation into Roxsana Hernandez's death has shined a light on the deadly business of mass incarceration that punitive immigration policies have created.



MAY 14, 2018

May 14: Bus from San Ysidro to San Luis Detention Center (Emerald).



MAY 15, 2018

Transfer from San Luis to El Paso (on a bus to an airplane and then another bus).



MAY 25, 2018

Roxsana coded 7 times between 12:48am and 3:32am. Staff made resuscitation efforts each time and she was pronounced dead at 3:32am.



MAY 16-17, 2018

Video surveillance footage shows Roxsana arriving at Cibola on May 16th. Ambulance to Cibola General Hospital on May 17th. Airlifted from Cibola General to Loveless Medical Center. Roxsana admitted at 10:23pm to ICU at Lovelace, where a doctor stated it was "too little too late."



MAY 24, 2018

Roxsana in critical condition.



MAY 11, 2018

Roxsana sent to ER, where she's diagnosed with cough, untreated HIV, and tachycardia. ER does NOT clear her for detention or transport. Referred to Scripps Medical Center in Chula Vista, CA for TB screening. Not finding TB, Scripps clears her for detention and transport. They note her untreated HIV as an afterthought, without providing medication but directing she needed medication from DHS.



MAY 9-14, 2018

In the "hieleras" **DIVERSIDAD SIN FRONTERAS REPORTS:** "She was processed and held for 5 days in the dreaded "icebox" - holding cells with extremely low temperatures - in US Customs & Border Protection suffering cold, lack of adequate food or medical care, with the lights on 24 hours a day, under lock & key."



MAY 9, 2018

Border Entry at San Ysidro **DIVERSIDAD SIN FRONTERAS REPORTS:** "Roxy exercised her legal right to seek asylum at the San Ysidro Port of Entry on the morning of May 9th."



MAY 7, 2018

Roxsana was not present, but other members of the LGBTQ caravan were. **DIVERSIDAD SIN FRONTERAS REPORTS:** "The loving shelter CARITAS in Tijuana that at one time during the caravan received 35+ LGBT members of the community was set on fire last night. This is how much they hate us. This is how transphobia works. They don't want us here."



MARCH 25, 2018

Tapachula, Chiapas **ACCORDING TO AN INTERVIEW ROXSANA GAVE TO BUZZFEED NEWS:** Stacy, a detainee at Cibola, said "she met Hernandez in Tapachula, Chiapas where they both joined the caravan that took off from the border city on March
